Thriving in an unequal world: How inequalities shape well-being and fuel well-being inequality.

Dr. Leonie C. Steckermeier, Otto-von-Guericke-Universität Magdeburg



Abstract: The talk aims to give an overview of subjective well-being in the light of different types of inequality. Starting with the individual, I will present how subjective well-being is socially structured – and how (and if) that relates to inequality. Since inequality can, ultimately, only exist between people and thus only on aggregate level, I will then move on to macro-level. I will review the more popular arguments in the social science literature on why inequality is detrimental to a society's overall level of subjective well-being and contrast these arguments with empirical evidence. In addition to economic inequality, which is (mostly due to availability and comparability) most widely used in research, I will also explore measures of social and environmental inequality. In the final part, I will then move on to inequality in well-being itself – which has not been extensively researched yet – looking at antecedents as well as consequences.

Dr. Leonie C. Steckermeier is a postdoctoral researcher at the Chair of Macrosociology, University in Magdeburg, Germany. She earned her master's degree in Empirical Political and Social Sciences from Stuttgart University, and successfully completed her PhD in sociology at Otto-von-Guericke University Magdeburg in 2022. Her research expertise centers around the domains of quality of life and subjective well-being, social inequality, individual autonomy, and trust. Her work has been published in several international journals such as International Journal of Comparative Sociology, World Development and Social Indicators Research.
